### Bylaw No. 3290

#### A bylaw to regulate the use of Parks and Recreational Facilities

The Council of the City of Chilliwack in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw may be cited as “Parks, Recreation and Culture Bylaw 2006, No. 3290”.
2. The “Parks and Recreation Bylaw 2004, No. 2990” and amendments thereto, are hereby repealed.

#### DEFINITIONS

3. In this bylaw:

“Bylaw Enforcement Officer” means that person appointed as such for the City of Chilliwack or their designate;

“City” means the City of Chilliwack;

“Civic Building” means all buildings owned or controlled by the City;

“Civic Properties or Civic Property” means all lands, dykes, and improvements owned or controlled by the City and includes a Civic Building;

“Council” means the Council of the City of Chilliwack;

“Department” means the Recreation and Culture Department or ~~Operations~~Public Works and Parks Department of the City of Chilliwack;

“Director” means those persons appointed as Director of Recreation and Culture and Director of ~~Operations~~Public Works and Parks for the City of Chilliwack or their designate;

“Dog Off Leash Area” means a portion of a park or trail that has been designated as an off leash area and is identified by posted signage.

“Homeless Person” means a person who has neither a fixed address nor a predictable safe residence to return to on a daily basis;

“Landscaped Area” means that part of a Civic Property that is used for the placement of any or a combination of the following elements:

- (a) Soft landscaping consisting of vegetation such as trees, shrubs, hedges, or ornamental plantings;
- (b) Hard landscaping consisting of non-vegetative materials such as brick, pavers, rock, stone, concrete, tile and wood, and including such features as a walkway, patio or deck; and,
- (c) Architectural elements consisting of fencing, walls, sculptures, gazebos, trellises, planters, benches and other similar features;
