1. SUMMARY OF ISSUE:

Council is requested to authorize staff to apply for shared funding under the Government of British Columbia Active Transportation Infrastructure Grant for sidewalks, cycle lanes, and multi-use pathways on Watson Road from Tyson Road to Vedder Road and on Keith Wilson Road from Tyson Road to Garrison Boulevard.

BC Active Transportation Fund Application 2023 / 2024

1. DEFINITION OF ISSUE:

Council is requested to authorize staff to apply for shared funding under the Government of British Columbia Active Transportation Infrastructure Grant for sidewalks, cycle lanes, and multi-use pathways on Watson Road from Tyson Road to Vedder Road and on Keith Wilson Road from Tyson Road to Garrison Boulevard.

2. BACKGROUND:

- 2.1 The BC Active Transportation Infrastructure Grant will provide up to \$500,000 or 50% of project costs to support the development of active transportation infrastructure for all ages and abilities.
- 2.2 The grant will fund projects such as multi-use protected travel lanes, pedestrian & cycling safety improvements, and lighting & wayfinding for up to two shovel-ready projects.
- 2.3 The Watson Road project is included in the Capital Plan, is identified in the 2018 Transportation Plan Update for road upgrades and is identified as a core cycling route in the 2017 Cycle Vision Plan.
 - 2.3.1 This project is planned to include street lighting, barrier curb, sidewalk, drainage, cycle lanes, and vehicle lane improvements and provides a key west-east connection with Mount Slesse Middle School, Watson Elementary School, the Valley Rail Trail, the Garrison Crossing Neighbourhood, Tzeachten First Nation and the Promontory Centre shopping district.
 - 2.3.2 McElhanney Consulting Services completed a pre-design evaluation of the project in 2018. The Class C estimate for the cost of the project was \$4,430,000, excluding land purchase.
 - 2.3.3 Should this grant application be successful, the City is expected to receive up to \$500,000 toward this project, leaving the other \$3,930,000 to be funded as part of the City's 2023 and 2024 capital budgets.
- 2.4 The Keith Wilson Road project is included in the Capital Plan, is a high-priority location as identified in the Active Transportation Plan, and is identified as a core cycling route in the 2017 Cycle Vision Plan.

- 2.4.1 This project is planned to include streetlighting, barrier curb, sidewalks, cycle lanes, multi-use paths, and vehicle lane improvements to finish a key connection between the Garrison Village neighbourhood and Tzeachten First Nation with the new Stitó:s Lá:lém Totí:lt Elementary / Middle School and the University of the Fraser Valley.
- 2.4.2 The City recently awarded the Design-Build contract for this section of works. With Hydro works included, the cost of the project is \$2.15 million.
- 2.4.3 Should this grant application be successful, the City is expected to receive up to approximately \$500,000 towards this project, leaving the other \$1.65 million to be funded as part of the City's 2023 and 2024 capital budgets.

3 RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation that Council endorse the application for the BC Active Transportation Infrastructure Grant 2023-2024, as described in this report, for the Watson Road and Keith Wilson Road active transportation and roadway improvements.

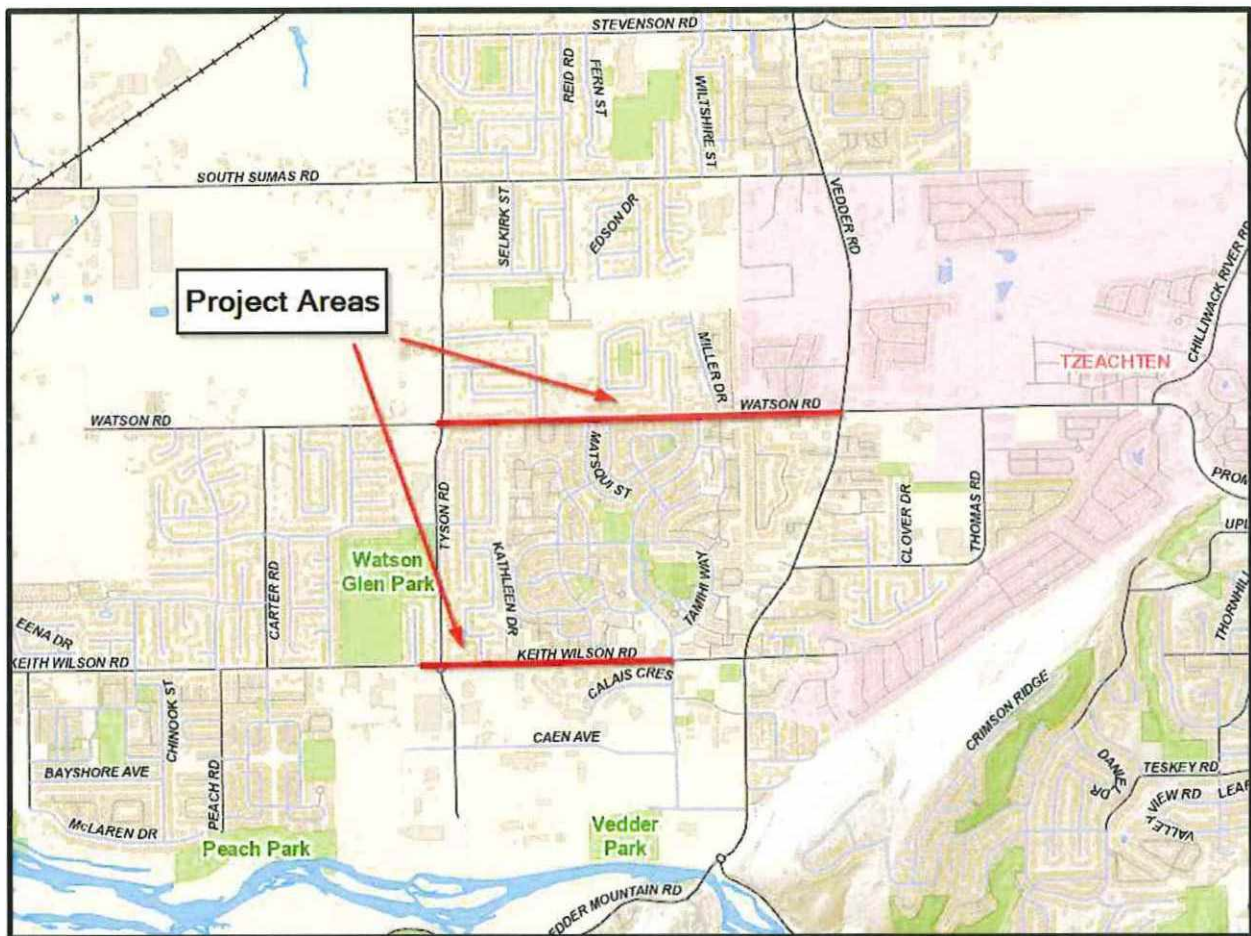


Figure "A" – Project Area
